

BID TO HOST PROPOSAL



LOCATION

Canmore, Alberta, Canada


Canmore, a small mountain town with a population of 14,000 is the proposed site for the MWC 2021. It rests at an altitude of 1,375 metres (4,511 feet) and is conveniently located on the Trans-Canada Highway, a four lane highway connecting to Calgary 100 kilometres to the east. The Nordic Centre, the proposed venue for MW 2021, is conveniently situated just a 5 minutes' drive downtown Canmore.

The town has all of the amenities such as grocery stores, hotels, restaurants (70 plus), coffee shops, a public swimming pool with hot tubs, a number of gyms, numerous wellness studios (spa, massage, physiotherapy), a climbing wall and many opportunities for gift shopping. It has a fully equipped hospital and several walk-in health clinics.

Canmore was the venue for the Nordic events of the 1988 Winter Olympics and since then has evolved into a year-round tourist destination and a major winter sports centre. It has hosted many regional, national and international ski events since then and the business community is well geared to providing excellent service.

Canmore Nordic Centre (CNC)

The races will be held at the Canmore Nordic Centre Provincial Park. Originally built for the 1988 Olympic Winter Games it has undergone several upgrades since then and has been the site for many regional, national and international events. The site is managed by Alberta Parks and has a number of full time staff to carry out necessary functions as well as three piston bullies with tillers, 3 Ginzu groomers, 7 snow machines and 4 Quadtrac ATVs.

The site sits at 1,425 metres (4,675 feet) altitude and boasts 65 kilometres of trails, most of which have widths of 12 metres. A high capacity snow making system is able to guarantee 7.5 kilometres of recreational and 12.5 kilometres FIS homologated race trails. As well, a 2.5 to 3 kilometre trail is opened in Mid-October using snow stored under sawdust over the summer allowing the race season to begin then. A night-skiing lit trail of 6.5 kilometres is also available.

There are two large stadiums (cross country and biathlon) offering good race start/finish opportunities. At this time, the plan is for MWC 2021 to use the biathlon stadium (to be enlarged next year). Close by the biathlon stadium and within 50 metres is a wax building with 24 rooms (3x5 metres), several smaller wax rooms and a wax test area. It is possible to bring additional wax trailers into the parking lot adjacent to the biathlon stadium and wax test area.

On site at the Nordic Centre, there are also indoor washrooms, a fully equipped gym, a cafeteria with high quality food and a high quality ski shop.

Weather Statistics for Event Dates

Weather data for the first 10 days of March over ten years (2007 to 2017) has been collected for Canmore and area. The mean values are listed below and the yearly data listed in Appendix B.

Temperatures

Mean Max for March 1 - 10 is 1.9 C. Mean Min for March 1 - 10 is -11.8 C.

- Snow (Precipitation) Mean Precipitation (water equivalent) 13.9 mm
- Humidity No data available.
- Snow on the ground

Snow on the ground at the Nordic Centre is often shallow but it is enduring due to low humidity and excellent grooming. Average snow on the ground for the March 1 - 10 period is 22.0 cm.

Alternate Site

Due to the extensive snow-making and snow farming capability of the Canmore Nordic Centre Provincial Park, an alternate site is not required.

TRAVEL AND ACCOMMODATION

Travel

Calgary International Airport is a 75 minute drive from Canmore. Calgary has daily direct, non-stop flight connections with Europe and North America. Connecting flights with Asia route through Vancouver International Airport.

- Appendix C shows costs of flights from London Heathrow, Frankfurt, Chicago O'Hare, Tokyo Narita, Montreal and Toronto as of December, 2017.
- All major rental car agencies are represented at Calgary International Airport.
- Multiple Airport Shuttle services are available on a frequent schedule.

Transportation in Canmore/Banff

There is regular bus service between Banff and Canmore on a frequent daily schedule. Participants who will wish to stay in Canmore can easily walk to the MWC2021 bus stop locations within the town. Participants staying in Banff and wishing to use their own rental car will be provided a central parking area in Canmore. Shuttle bus service between the Nordic Centre and the central parking area and the townsite will be provided by the Organizing Committee.


Accommodation

Accommodation costs in Banff/Canmore: the Bow Valley communities of Banff and Canmore have a large number of hotels and other accommodation options. Total number of guest rooms is in excess of 8,500. Accommodation type ranges from 1 star to 5 start, hotel, motel, apartments and bed and breakfast providers. Appendix D shows sample prices, as of December 2017, for the March time period.

CULTURAL DAY




Letters of support








Race Course Map - 5 km









Race Course Map - 10 km









Race Course Map - 15 km








Stadium Start/Finish Area Map
